TUSCANY

The Val d'Orcia is one of the most photographed places in Italy and for good reason as it's absolutely stunning!

At house N001, our Plinius adventure started, so to say that we know the area very well. Together with some locals, we've gathered all our favorite places in and around the Val d'Orcia—including a few really cool spots nearby, plus a little city guide for Florence.

Siena, Montalcino, Montepulciano, and Pienza also have plenty to offer, and there are so many other charming small villages that deserve a visit too. When you explore the area, make sure to discover the villages closest to you! Each one has its own unique character, and you'll quickly feel part of village life, where time moves at a gentler rhythm.

The towns may be small, but each one offers more than enough to explore: amazing wines (hello, Brunellos!), delicious food like pecorino cheeses, and unforgettable landscapes.

Although some spots can feel a little polished for tourists, there are still so many places where the genuine soul of Tuscany shines through. I'm sharing some of my favorite finds — hope you'll enjoy them as much as we do!:)

Bodo, Ellen and Ghari

SIENA

La perla di Toscana – Siena is a timeless medieval beauty in the heart of Tuscany. With its beautiful squares, gothic architecture, and the legendary Palio, it's the pride of the region.

Osteria Le Logge

fantastic food and they have a huge wine list here.

Osteria Da Trombicche

A Slow food restaurant just a short walk from Piazza del Campo. historic osteria provides a genuine taste of Sienese hospitality.

Osteria La Sosta di Violante

Authentic Tuscan cuisine. Another Slow food restaurant that serves great traditional food.

Osteria Babazuf

This is a celebrated restaurant by locals, recognized for its commitment to traditional Tuscan cuisine.

Aloe&Wolf Vintage

you'll find the most beautiful vintage treasures here.

MONTALCINO

Montalcino is a hilltop haven known for its legendary Brunello, breathtaking views, and old historical center.

Caffe Fiaschetteria Italiana - 1888

Ancient bar, fantastic interior; at the back of the establishment, you can request a wine tasting. They have a unique collection of the most exclusive wines. Also a great place for coffee.

Da Rizieri

Here you can tap by the glass and taste all the 'great' Italian wines!

La Sosta

Tucked away in the historic center, this charming organic shop and wine bar is perfect for savoring Tuscany's finest wines and stocking up on regional treasures like olive oil, homemade pasta, jams, and teas.

MONTEPULCIANO

True it is a bit touristy, but it is also beautiful and definitely worth a trip. These are the places we love to go:

Caffè Poliziano

Whether it is for a cup of coffee or an aperitivo this is the place! The most elegant cafe of the whole area with an art nouveau design and a breathtaking views over the rolling hills of Tuscany.

La Grotta

Restaurant "La Grotta" is set in an authentic and charming sixteenth century building with a garden terrace, directly opposite the Church of San Biagio (one of the best examples of Tuscan Renaissance architecture). La Grotta strives to offer a perfect balance between traditional Tuscan cuisine and modern gastronomy.

Osteria dell'acquacheta

a small Slow Food place which is know for its steaks. Tables are all close together and it has a large clientele, which makes it necessary to book.

PIENZA

Known for it pecorino cheese, im a fan!

La Bandita Townhouse

Our absolute favorite place to go in Pienza for lunch or dinner is La Bandita Townhouse, a small restaurant and wine bar with an open kitchen. There is also a gorgeous covered outdoor seating area inside the walled medieval garden.

Latte di Luna

A great Italian trattoria to have lunch or dinner.

WINETASTIGS

Poggio Antico

For a tour and wine tasting, I can recommend Poggio Antico to you... amazing Brunellos and a beautiful vineyard!

Villa le Prata Wine Resort

A beautiful spot, where they also organise lovely lunches in the vineyard. Also a really nice place to spend the night.

The Talosa wine cellar

The hidden "secret" of Montepulciano is the Talosa wine cellar; The Talosa Cellar dates back to the 16th century and visiting is like stepping back time. The brick passageways contain a series of vaults and niches where the barrels are placed.

Boscarelli

One of our favorite wineries of the area is Boscarelli. This winefarm is located just outside Montepulciano and we always try to bring a few bottles back home.

Casa Newton

This new hotel is totally worth checking out. Whether you're here for a dinner or just having a cocktail to take a look at the amazing interior.

<u>Dopolavoro la Foce</u>

Originally built in 1939 as a gathering place for the agricultural workers of the namesake estate, today it's a wonderful restaurant specializing in traditional Tuscan dishes — all served with a breathtaking view.

Taverna di Mozart

At this restaurant dishes are made with local ingredients, the menu celebrates the rich flavors of Tuscany in the purest way.

Fonte alla Vena

In San Quirico d'Orcia serves traditional, seasonal dishes that honor the flavors of the region and celebrate cucina povera. The simple kitchen!

RESTAURANTS

TRATTORIA SOSTANZA

A trip to Florence is not complete without a visit to Trattoria Sostanza: a Florentine favourite for more than 150 years. The favorites from Mimi (who I always trust): Bistecca Fiorentina, The tortino di carciofi the meringue cake and the butter chicken

Il Santino

A really good wine bar with the best quality of cured hams, cheese and antipasti. They have organic wines which they source locally. Next to the wine bar they also have a beautiful restaurant (il santo bevitore) a panifico.

C-ucina

This is not a classic place, but this is a cool place. You can feel the creative vibe from the team behind it. It has an innovative menu from which you would love to order everything.

FLEAMARKETS

1st Sunday (and Saturday before)

Arezzo — 400 stands

The biggest and most famous flea market in Tuscany. Best for antiques, silver, and unique finds.

2nd Sunday

Florence (Piazza Santo Spirito) — 100 stands
Charming neighborhood market with antiques and vintage finds.

3rd Sunday (and Saturday before)

Florence (Piazza dell'Indipendenza) — 100 stands Large market in a park near the train station.

3rd Sunday

Siena (Piazza del Mercato) — 90 stands Market with a focus on vintage books and records.

4th Sunday

Florence (Sant'Ambrogio) — 70 stands Regular food market that expands into antiques and vintage; great Sunday lunch spot nearby.

Biannual (next: March 9-10, 2024)

- Arezzo (Mercato delle Pulci) 200 open-air and 600 indoor vendors
- Massive market perfect for treasure hunters, entry €3.
